

# Gas Cylinder Safety

If you plan to bring gas cylinders to Blazing Swan you must know how to store, transport and use them safely. Below are some tips to keep you safe.

## Safe Storage:

- Store gas bottles upright, in a well-ventilated area outside.
- Store out of direct sunlight and in a cool area.
- Turn off valves when the gas bottle is not in use.
- Store gas bottles away from flammable liquids and aerosols.

## Secure Transportation:

- Carry gas bottle upright at all times.
- If transporting a gas bottle in a car, the gas bottle should be no more than 9kg, positioned upright, and firmly secured.
- Only two gas bottles should be transported in a single car.
- Keep gas bottles out of direct sunlight.

## Safe Gas Bottle Usage:

- Always read the manufacturer's instructions.
- Portable gas bottles and butane gas stoves should not be used indoors or in confined spaces.
- Take caution when using LPG fuel in windy condition as burners can blow out.
- When disconnecting, shut off the valve first, and keep away from flames.
- If you are using the gas bottle for cooking, do not use automotive LPG

**Never use a fuel-burning appliance inside your tent or awning. Even a warm barbecue can be lethal.**

## TOP TIPS:

- Never take a BBQ into a tent, awning, caravan or motorhome.
- Never use a fuel-burning appliance to heat your tent or awning.
- Never run a gas-, petrol-, or diesel-powered generator inside a tent or awning.
- Don't cook inside your tent or awning.
- Don't use any other gas, charcoal or liquid fuel appliances inside a tent or awning.
- Don't rely on a carbon monoxide (CO) detector to keep you safe in a tent or awning.
